A line of double electricity poles across the middle of an arable field provides an operational challenge in terms of cultivations, irrigation etc but an ideal location to create a beetle bank. These will encourage biodiversity and attract insects whilst removing a potential hazard. This strip was created in 2002 by ploughing in opposite directions to create a raised bank and drilled with a mixture of Cocksfoot, Timothy and Creeping Red Fescue.
